An InFO contains valuable safety information for operators that should help them meet certain administrative, regulatory, or operational requirements, with relatively low urgency or impact on safety. The contents of this document do not have the force and effect of law and are not meant to bind the public in any way. This document is intended only to provide clarity to the public regarding existing requirements under the law or agency policies.

Subject: Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) Aircraft Ground Deicing Program.

Purpose: This InFO provides information related to the aircraft ground deicing program for Title 14 of the Code of Federal Regulations Part 121 and 135 operators.

Background: The FAA publishes information annually intended to aid operators in the development of their aircraft ground deicing programs. Some of this information is updated through the course of the year to reflect changes in data and operational environments.

Discussion: Winter 2022-2023 ground deicing program information was published in late July/early August 2022, but is subject to updates in support of flight safety. Because of this, it is imperative operators know where the documents are located and periodically check for updates. At the time of publication of this InFO, the following versions are the most current:

- Holdover Tables Revision 1.1, dated September 7, 2022
- Regression Information, dated July 29, 2022
- Standardized International Aircraft Ground Deicing Program, dated July 1, 2021
- DEVA Checklist, August 2008
- DSHOTs Database, dated July 29, 2022
