Office of Audit and Evaluation Annual Report to Congress Fiscal Year 2022

Title 49 of the United States Code § 106(t)(7)

Legislative Mandate

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Office of Audit and Evaluation (AAE) submits this Annual Report to Congress in response to Title 49 of the United States Code (49 U.S.C.) § 106(t)(7), titled *Office of Whistleblower Protection and Aviation Safety Investigations*.

This report summarizes the work that the FAA Office of Audit and Evaluation initiated with regard to a number of critical aviation safety activities during Fiscal Year 2022 (FY2022). AAE conducted this work in support of the FAA's continuing mission to provide the safest, most efficient aerospace system in the world. In addition to conducting investigations under §106(t), AAE performs many other important safety-related investigations, safety oversight activities and Whistleblower Ombudsman consultations. Those who filed reports with AAE, as well as those FAA professionals who provided their subject matter expertise to assist AAE in its work, all demonstrated a strong commitment to safety.

During this reporting period, AAE investigated or oversaw disclosures pertaining to nearly every FAA organizational entity. Many of the allegations contained in these disclosures identified programmatic or operational deficiencies that could have impacted safety directly. In some cases, allegations were substantiated by our investigations, and AAE's recommendations resulted in policy changes and the implementation of noteworthy corrective actions by the FAA. Overall, senior FAA officials were open and receptive in response to AAE's recommendations for improving aviation safety and FAA operations.

In December 2020, as part of the Aircraft Certification, Safety and Accountability Act (the Act), Congress changed the name of the "Aviation Safety Whistleblower Investigation Office," which is ostensibly AAE, to the "Office of Whistleblower Protection and Aviation Safety Investigations." Under the Act, the purpose of this designation was to emphasize the office's role with regard to accountability, aviation safety, and whistleblower protection. The Act also established the position of Whistleblower Ombudsman. FY2022, AAE established the "Office of Whistleblower Ombudsman," and merged existing investigation-related functions under a new office named the "Office of Whistleblower & Aviation Safety Investigations" to meet these statutory requirements. The FAA named an Ombudsman in August 2022.

AAE appreciates the support it has received from senior officials throughout the FAA and the entire U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), the DOT Office of Inspector General (OIG), the U.S. Office of Special Counsel (OSC), the U.S. Government Accountability Office (GAO), and members of Congress and their staff members during this reporting period. AAE looks forward to continuing this important mission in the coming years.

Safety Oversight, Investigations, and Whistleblower Protection

The AAE's Aviation Safety Whistleblower Investigation Program receives and manages safety disclosures from FAA employees and employees of certificate holders under § 106(t).

Disclosures from FAA personnel that allege safety violations are investigated either by AAE investigators or FAA subject matter experts. AAE, at times in coordination with other FAA subject matter experts, oversees all investigations extensively. Once an investigation is completed, AAE investigators prepare an independent Report of Investigation (ROI) that outlines the findings. AAE provides the ROI to the FAA Administrator and the affected FAA functional organization (e.g., Flight Standards Service, Aircraft Certification, Air Traffic Organization, or Airports) for corrective action, as recommended by AAE. In response, the Administrator provides a formal response to the recommendations, to include any implemented or planned corrective actions.

Although the ultimate responsibility for implementing a corrective action plan falls upon the appropriate FAA functional organization, AAE monitors the implementation of those corrective actions taken as a result of AAE findings to ensure completion of that implementation. AAE also evaluates the effectiveness of those corrective actions.

Significant Activity October 1, 2021 – September 30, 2022

Ombudsman Consultation

The FAA appointed a Whistleblower Ombudsman in August 2022. Since that appointment, eight FAA employees consulted with the Ombudsman.¹ Of these 8 FAA employees, all but one consulted with the Ombudsman specifically about retaliation for whistleblowing about issues, including those that are non-safety related.² These employees also sought advice on how to handle alleged mismanagement. One matter was referred to the OPR for investigation, and five employees were advised to report their concerns to the OSC. One employee did not continue their communication with the Ombudsman. The last employee chose to address the matter with their program office before pursuing further action through the Ombudsman.

FAA Hotline Operations

Pursuant to FAA Order 1070.1A Change 1, the FAA Hotline receives reports related to unsafe and unauthorized aviation activity that may violate an FAA regulation, order, or any other provision of federal law related to aviation safety; or of fraud, waste, abuse, or misconduct

associated with FAA programs, personnel, organizations, or facilities.³ The FAA Hotline receives reports from FAA employees, the aviation community, law enforcement, and the public via an online web form, email, or mail. Based upon an analysis of all matters submitted to the FAA Hotline in FY2022, there were more than 5,500 referrals to FAA organizations for investigation or other appropriate action.
