COVID STATUS

- > Numbers have fallen since 2nd wave
- > Biggest concern now the variants
- > Still exceeding numbers from the 1st wave
- > Keeping the workplace safe
 - · Masks, hand sanitizer, reducing touchpoints, non-essential personnel working from home
 - · Cleaning from outside companies and individuals
 - · Cleaned and wrapped positions on standby
- > 14 day isolation entering Canada
 - Includes mandatory stay at approved hotel until negative test (your expense)
 - Still regional bubbles in Canada
- > Talks regarding industry support from government ongoing



Traffic in September 2020 decreased by an average of 62.6 per cent compared to the same month in 2019.


Traffic in January 2021 decreased by an average of 56.8 percent compared to the same month in 2020.

Not proportional – flight schools, traffic to smaller, rural communities has not been affected the same way as Polar or trans-Atlantic flights


Trying to predict the return of traffic – moving target

ARCTIC HIGH TRAFFIC 2021


- Watching traffic in this specialty not dependent on Canadian domestic traffic

HIGH LEVEL AIRSPACE BY ACC



RPAS PLAN



- > Online App
- Majority of requests automatically approved/denied
- Other requests go to trained personnel for that airspace (Tower controller, etc)
- Requests to be processed within 72 hours
- > Currently beta testing in Eastern Canada
- > Further rollout/training expected this spring
