- Most American Airlines destinations where passenger service has been suspended are currently served by cargo only flights
- Minimal restart preparations will be required for passenger service





What is needed to restart passenger service



- Most American Airlines passenger destinations are currently by served cargo only flights
- Minimal restart preparations will be required for passenger service
- Due to crew layover restrictions, all AAL passenger and cargo flights, from North America to China and Hong Kong, operate with a tech stop in either ICN or NRT to change crews. These routings generally keep flights out of Polar airspace
- American Airlines is ready to resume normal passenger service to all destinations previously served as soon as entry requirements are relaxed for passengers and crew
