SAN CARLOS AIRPORT

- General Aviation Reliever Airport
- Reliever Airports reduce general aviation congestion that would otherwise exist at:
 - San Francisco International Airport
 - Norman Y. Mineta San Jose International Airport
 - Oakland International Airport.
- San Carlos Airport is responsible for:
 - Safety and security of aircraft on the ground
 - Maintenance of runways, taxiways, ramps, building facilities, and
 - Following the guidelines set by the FAA for safe operations and equal access.

TYPES OF OPERATIONS

- Flight training
- Charter operations
- Scenic flights/tours
- Sheriff's Air Squadron
- Search and Rescue services
- Air-Ambulance flights
- Cal Fire air response
- Coast Guard training flights
- Staging for significant events



Home to approximately 500 aircraft and 25 airport businesses.

AIRCRAFT DISTURBANCE STUDY

- Worked with consultants to review best practices for a noise management program.
- Worked with the FAA and Surf Air to implement the Bayside Visual Approach (BVA) 6-month operational test to evaluate an alternative flight path into the San Carlos Airport.
- Community outreach:
 - Implement a noise management tracking system & website
 - Town Hall meetings (5).
- Received FAA funding for a Part 150 Noise Study.
- Conducted statistical tracking of noise complaints, impacted neighborhoods, and percentage of flights flying the BVA during the 6month operational test. Data was reported to the FAA.



COMMUNITY CONCERNS

- San Carlos Airport is working with the FAA and Surf Air to develop alternative flight paths to reduce the impact of air traffic on surrounding communities.
 - The Bayside Visual Approach (BVA) was the result of that effort.
 - BVA moves aircraft over the Bay and reduces the impact of overflights for more than 140,000 residents in the region.
 - County recommends approving the BVA as an all weather VFR approach, and an instrument procedure (chartered visual approach) available to all operators.
- County working with a consultant and Surf Air on alternative flight paths and higher altitudes. County is committed to involving the public in that process.

NOISE MANAGEMENT PLAN

- Work with consultant and surrounding communities to develop alternative arrival and departure flight paths.
- Hire an Airport Communications Specialist.
- Implement Vector Airport Systems.
- Conduct the FAA Part 150 Noise Study.
- Update the Airport's Rules & Regulations and Minimum Standards primary management documents.
- Explore a pilot incentive program for complying with voluntary noise abatement procedures.
- Evaluate the purchase of mobile noise monitors for use in the community.
