## Changes to Testing for a Remote Pilot Certificate with a Small Aircraft Rating

April 21, 2021, will be the effective date for a revision of 14 CFR part 107 and a new 14 CFR part 89. These changes will have a direct effect on airman knowledge testing for a Remote Pilot Certificate with a Small Aircraft Rating. The following testing topics will be placed on the revised Unmanned Aircraft General (UAG) airman knowledge test on April 6, 2021:

- Operations Over People
- Remote Identification
- Night Operations

The new testing topics will not be administered on a separate test, they will be integrated into the Unmanned Aircraft General – Small airman knowledge test. A person who successfully passes the Unmanned Aircraft General – Small airman knowledge test on or after April 6, 2021, will meet the requirements to exercise the certificate privileges of Night Operations within the boundaries set forth in 14 CFR part 107.

Beginning April 6, 2021, the Unmanned Aircraft Recurrent (UGR) airman knowledge test will no longer be offered for knowledge recency. Any person who holds a Remote Pilot Certificate with a Small Aircraft Rating may take recurrent training in place of the UGR airman knowledge test. This training will be available on the <u>FAA Safety Team's webpage</u> beginning on April 6, 2021.
