 - Part 107 registrations, airspace authorizations and waivers, operational waivers and accident reporting
 - Section 336 registrations

- Status of active and historical requests available to view
- Designed to speed up review and approval of UAS operator's requests


he vemote pilot in command must report any sUAS accident to the FAA no later than 10 days after a Part 107 operation that meet the following criteria:

- . Serious injury to any person or any loss of consciousness; or
- . Damage to any property, other than the small unmanned aircraft, unless one of the following conditions is satisfied:
 - . The cost of repair (including materials and labor) does not exceed \$500; or
 - . The fair market value of the property does not exceed \$500 in the event of total loss.



Mark Your Aircraft



You must mark each aircraft with the assigned unique registration number before it is operated.

Safety Guidance

- . Fly at or below 400 feet
- · Keep your aircraft within your line of sight
- Be aware of FAA airspace requirements
- · Never fly near other aircraft, especially near airports
- Never fly over groups of people, public events, or stadiums full of people
- Never fly near emergency response efforts such as wildfires
- · Never fly under the influence of drugs or alcohol

To fly under the Special Rule for Model Aircraft, you must follow community-based aero-modeling club safety guidelines and fly within the programming of a nation-wide community-based aero-modeling organization.
