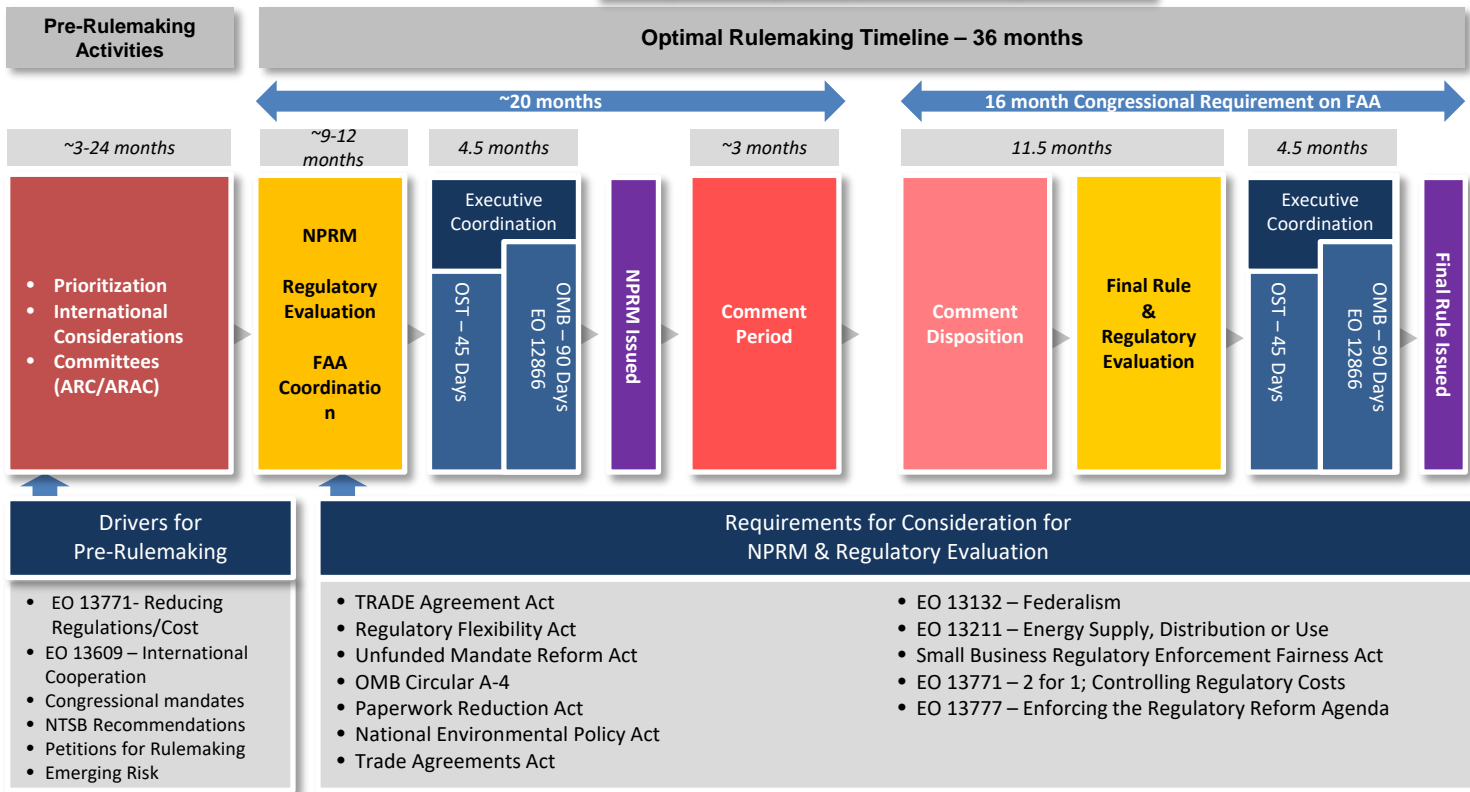

FAA Rulemaking Process



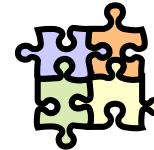
Administrative Procedures Act
governs regulatory process for all agencies



Rulemaking Governance & Prioritization Approach



- Strategic Prioritization
 - Addresses top-down, bottom-up and emergent rulemaking needs
 - Supports workload balancing
- No “one-size-fits-all” approaches
 - Process flexibility - expand/contract in response to complexity
 - Enables parallel work streams and non-sequential approaches
- Early Engagement
 - Proactively engages industry stakeholders
 - Incorporates feedback loops early and through a longer period of policy development

Building Blocks

- Point of Origin
 - Top-Down: Strategic Rulemaking
 - Bottom-Up: Annual Calls
 - Emergent: Interagency & Mandates
- Rulemaking Management Council
 - Resource Allocation & Metering Plan (RAMP)
 - Annual RAMP Designation
 - RAMP Re-assignment
- Office of Rulemaking
 - Integrated Rulemaking Plan
